- 20 nations represented

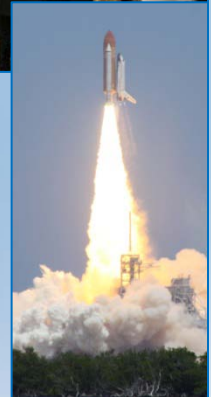
# National Space Symposium

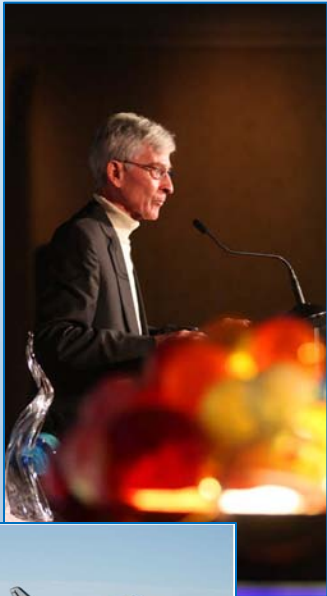

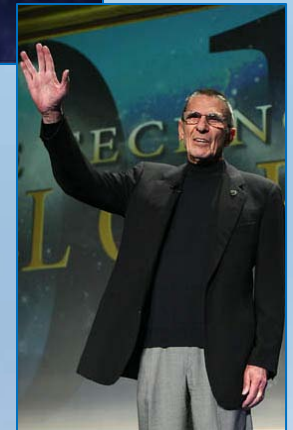

## The Space Foundation will outreach to the National Space Grant by providing the following



- a complimentary 10' x 20' "end" booth space
- 15 specially selected New Generation Space Leader symposium registrations for current space grant graduate students (21 years of age or older) at a rate of \$395 ea. (meals not included with the exception of the Thursday "NewGen" lunch)
- One complimentary Symposium registration plus 1 ticket to - the Corporate Partnership Dinner on Tuesday and 1 ticket to the Space Technology Hall of Fame Dinner on Thursday for the Chair of the National Council of Space Grant Directors or designee

## The Space Foundation will outreach to the National Space Grant by providing the following



- complimentary Symposium registrations (meals not included) for up to four Directors of state Space Grant programs selected by the Chair of the National Council of Space Grant Directors
- Space Grant may register up to 20 additional attendees – either students, (21 years of age or older) and or state directors/assistants – for a standard symposium registration at the special National Space Grant promotional rate of \$595 at a savings of \$500 - (meals not included). This promotional symposium registration does NOT include access to New Generation activities

## The Space Foundation will outreach to the National Space Grant by providing the following



- Symposium day passes (meals not included) to Space Grant students who register for career day, April 19th
- Up to 8 Exhibitor Badges for personnel to staff the booth

## The National Space Grant will agree to/be:



- staff the booth at all times that the Exhibit Center is open (April 16<sup>th</sup> – 19<sup>th</sup> )
- responsible for any shipping, decorator and electrical costs associated with the booth
- ensure that the booth display is meaningful and will demonstrate the positive outreach and mission of the NSGC program, to include student projects, posters etc.
- select and pay for 15 current space grant graduate students (age 21 years +) to attend Symposium at a rate of \$395 each

## The National Space Grant will agree to/be:



- have the 15 students selected to attend the Symposium at the “NewGen” rate (\$395) to attend all daily New Generation activities conducted during the Symposium
- cover travel expenses and associated costs
- actively promote among its Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska and New Mexico affiliate organizations, for Space Grant students to attend career day, April 19th. (RSVP's will be required.)
