for the Congress of the United States,
which conceived the program,
and which funds the program.

Space Grant has problems! Two of them!

- 1) Congressional disfunction in recent years has led to the omission of Language in the Space Grant appropriation directing that SG funding go, ~ equally, to each of the States.**
- 2) NASA HQ reaction to the lack of direction from Congress, has been to provide directly to Space Grant only the amount in the Administration request - NOT the amount that Congress actually intends Space Grant to receive.**
