## 2020 Alliance Summary

## Hill Visit Recap

- Space Grant Alliance focused on restoring and growing
  Space Grant Budget for a growing STEM workforce crisis
- FY21 Alliance Request:
  - \$52M ask with 85% base funding (\$844K per state),
  - 10% admin fee for each program in the Office of STEM Engagement
  - 5% for Special Projects





## 2020 Alliance Summary

#### Hill Visit Takeaways

- Space Grant enjoys broad bi-partisan support
  - \$52M ask well received
  - Viewed as an effective program
- NASA Space Grant program administration
  - Inability to meet 5% administrative fee language

#### Post-Hill Activities

- Worked with VSA to develop Dear Colleague Support Letter
- Your strong advocacy led to 107 House member signatures





#### **Treasurer's Comments**

#### **Update on Dues**

- Invoices for 2021 dues were emailed on October 3
- With the elimination of the tiered funding levels, alliance dues are now equalized (every jurisdiction pays the same)
- Survey was conducted to gauge impact of COVID. 36 members responded. 32 said no hardship. 4 said may be issues.

#### **Financial Report**

- Audit of 2018 and 2019 finally wrapping up
- Members will be emailed a year end (2020) financial report as well as any relevant findings from the audit in December

#### Unexpended Space Grant Funds Survey

Look into unexpended funding amounts and investigate causes, magnitude,
 recurrence, effects and possible mitigating strategies



## Where Are We Currently?

## Appropriations Process Delayed

- Continued Resolution approved through Dec. 11
- House completed 10 of 12 spending bills
- Senate will post spending bills in fall
- Possible completion in 1Q 2021

## COVID-19 Response Legislation

- House approved \$3.4 trillion HEROES Act in May
- House released \$2.2 trillion proposal in September
- Senate has yet to act, negotiations stalled
- Possible targeted relief bills before election
- Senate Focus on Supreme Court





## FY2021 Space Grant Appropriations Priorities

- Multiple Members Submitted Forms or Letters (reported)
- 107 House Members Signed Dear Colleague Support Letter
- Multiple Senators Expressed Support for Space Grant at Senate Budget Hearing

## **Outlook for Fall**

- House of Representatives in recess to campaign
- Potential COVID-19 response negotiations continue...
- Supreme Court Nomination in Senate
  - Multiple-day confirmation hearing
  - Full debate on Senate floor
  - Few legislative options for Democrats
- NASA Reauthorization





## Lame Duck Session

### FY2021 Appropriations

- Current CR extends through Dec. 11
- Second CR expected:
  - Change of power in White House will likely lead to CR extension into next year
  - President Trump victory could bring FY2021 appropriations to a close in December

## COVID Response Legislation

- President Trump victory could lead to small COVID response bill following election – little appetite to spend more than \$1.5 trillion – no talk of economic stimulus
- Vice President Biden victory could lead to larger proposal early next year including economic stimulus





## **Election Outlook**

- Democrats likely to retain control of the House of Representatives
  - Current divide 235 (D) -198 (R) 1 (I)
- Control of the United States Senate will be decided in November
  - Current divide -53 (R) 45 (D) 2 (I)
  - Competitive seats in Alabama (D), Arizona (R), Colorado (R), Georgia (R), Iowa (R), Maine (R), Montana (R), North Carolina (R), South Carolina (R)

#### **Presidential Race**

- Toss Ups: Arizona, Wisconsin, North Carolina, Florida
- Leans R: Texas, Iowa, Ohio, Georgia
- Leans D: Nevada, Minnesota, Michigan, Pennsylvania, New Hampshire





## **Crystal Ball for Next Congress**

- Regardless of outcome
  - FY 2021 (and 2022!) appropriations
  - Maybe broader COVID legislation if the economy continues to drag
- Biden administration + Dem. Senate control (no super majority)
  - Further COVID relief and future stimulus bill
  - Democratic priorities for legislation: R&D investment and tax policies, infrastructure package, agency reauthorizations (NASA, NSF, DOE) and new emphasis points in existing programs
- Biden administration + Rep. Senate control (no super majority)
  - Some reauthorizations (NASA, NSF, DOE), but more limited in scale
- Second Trump administration + Dem. Senate control
  - Some reauthorization, but more limited in scale. Keep an eye on tax/reconciliation





## Advocacy in an Age of COVID-19

- Expect Phone Meetings—No In-Person Meetings/ Limited Zoom
  - Status of Capitol Complex/Status of DC 2 Week Quarantine
  - Staffers Mostly Working From Home
  - Large "fly-ins" Strongly Discouraged
  - Video Conferences NOT the Norm
- Advocacy Still Critical
  - New Congress, New Members
  - Importance of Keeping Old Contacts Strong
